Keynote speakers



Önder Bakan is the Deputy President at the Presidency of Migration Management since July 15, 2023. He served as the District Governor of Beşiktaş between 2018-2023 and as the Head of Support Services Department at the Directorate General of Migration Management between 2013-2018. He also held the position of district governor in various districts of Türkiye. He completed his undergraduate education at Istanbul University, Faculty of Political Sciences, Department of Public Administration and his master's degree at Ankara University on Public Administration Metropolitan Municipalities.

Sietske Duller is the Director for Migration Policy at the Directorate-General for Migration within The Netherlands Ministry for Justice and Security since April 2023. Previously she has served as Acting Director since March 2022. In her current capacity she is responsible for the entire Dutch migration policy, ranging from asylum and reception policy to border management, return and legal migration. Previously she was head of the unit Supervision, Legal Migration and Nationality, Deputy Director of Migration Policy and Deputy Director Communications within the same ministry. She studied Communication and Information Sciences at Tilburg University.





Michael Spindelegger has extensive experience in international relations through his work in the Federal Government of the Republic of Austria.
